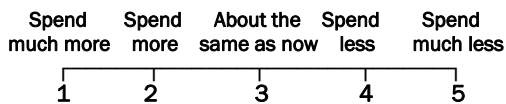

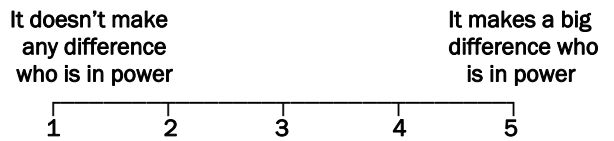

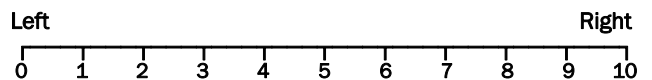
3. Some people say that it doesn't make any difference who is in power. Others say that it makes a big difference who is in power. Please circle the number that best reflects your opinion.



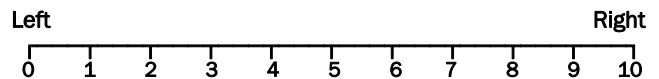
